**TRAINING TITLE**      Fog Driving Tips

**KEY TEACHING POINTS**

Fog goes hand-in-hand with warm weather and high humidity. It is unpredictable. Fog often shows up without warning. It may last a few feet or stretch for miles.

When fog arrives, consider postponing your trip until the fog clears.

If you see a patch of fog or mist on the road ahead of you, slow down gradually. If you slow down too suddenly, the driver behind you may crash into you. On the other hand, if you don't slow down at all, and the driver in front of you does, you are in danger of hitting his car.

Use wipers and defroster, as necessary, for maximum vision.

Turn on your low beam headlights - even if it is the middle of the day. Remember, those lights will not only help you see, but they will make it easier for others to see you. Don't turn on your high beams because they will cause glare and interfere with your vision.

Try to pick up and follow the right edge of the road for guidance. Avoid hunching forward to see better, you will see more if you sit normally.
