KEY TEACHING POINTS		
<p>Wastewater and sludge contain millions of biological organisms. Some of these are infectious and dangerous and cause diseases such as tetanus, typhoid, dysentery, and hepatitis. Personnel handling these materials should thoroughly wash their hands with soap and water, particularly before handling food or smoking.</p> <p>Do not pipette anything by mouth. Pipette all samples and reagents by mechanical means (rubber pipette bulbs) to avoid taking a chance on severe illness or death.</p> <p>Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (i.e., gloves, faceshield, etc.) for the tasks.</p> <p>Never drink from a beaker or other laboratory glassware.</p> <p>Though not mandatory, inoculations are recommended to protect yourself.</p>
