**TRAINING TITLE**      **Bloodborne Pathogens Precautions**

**KEY TEACHING POINTS**

**PREVENTION**  
Whenever there is a chance you could be exposed to bloodborne pathogens, wear personal protective equipment such as gloves, a gown or apron, protective eyewear and a mask or face shield.

**WORK PRACTICE CONTROLS**

- Remove your gloves and wash your hands and contaminated body area immediately with soap and water.
- Use a towel to turn the spigot handles so you don't recontaminate yourself or others.
- If you can't wash immediately with soap and water, use antiseptic towelettes and wash with soap and water as soon as possible.
- Flush your eyes, nose or other mucous membranes with water if they have been exposed.

**IMMUNIZATIONS**  
If you are exposed to raw sewage, you may be eligible for immunization against Hepatitis B. There is no vaccine against HIV. The immunization is provided free of charge by the City. If you have not been vaccinated, contact your supervisor if you desire to take the immunization.
