TRAINING TITLE Vertical Crankshaft Engines

KEY TEACHING POINTS

- Read and follow instructions in the operators manual.
- Before servicing the engine or equipment, always disconnect the spark plug. Ground leads to prevent sparks that could cause fires.
- On engines equipped with a battery and/or electric start, disconnect the battery cables from the battery. Always disconnect the negative cable first.
- Before disconnecting the negative ground cable, make sure all switches are OFF.
- Engine components can get extremely hot from operation. Do not touch these areas.. Never operate the engine with heat shields or guards removed.
- Never tamper with the governor components or settings to increase the maximum speed.
- Batteries contain sulfuric acid. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, and clothing.
- Batteries produce explosive hydrogen gas while being charged. Charge batteries only in well-ventilated areas.
- Gasoline is extremely flammable and its vapors can explode if ignited. Store gasoline only in approved containers, in well-ventilated, unoccupied buildings away from flames or sparks.
- Engine exhaust gases contain poisonous carbon monoxide. Carbon Monoxide is odorless, colorless, and can cause death if inhaled. Avoid inhaling exhaust fumes and never run the engine in a close building or confined area.
- Keep hands, feet, hair, and clothing away from moving parts to prevent injury.
- Never touch electrical wires or components while the engine is running.
